Staff or elected official of your local government serves on a leadership team of the digital inclusion coalition or collaboration.

- The Digital Inclusion Network leadership team consists of staff from the City of Portland, Multnomah County, and Multnomah County Library.

Staff or elected official of your local government participates, in an official capacity, in the local digital inclusion coalition.

- Office for Community Technology staff and Multnomah County representatives participate in the Digital Inclusion Network in an official capacity.

Your local government provides significant material support to the coalition, such as coordinating the meetings, providing meeting space, providing refreshments.

- City of Portland, Office for Community Technology staff coordinates and virtually convenes the Digital Inclusion Network.
